Devotional: Cultivating the Fruit of the Spirit Daily

Godly character is the foundation of a man worth having as a husband. This season of singleness is a prime time to cultivate the **fruit of the Spirit** in your life — love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These qualities don't develop overnight but require intentional daily growth.

Devotional: Surrendering to God's Perfect Timing

Devotional: Preparing Your Heart to Love and Serve
