# Devotional: Finding God's Strength in Your Brokenness

Loneliness and loss bring deep pain, yet God promises His nearness to the brokenhearted. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that in moments of crushing sorrow, God draws close, offering comfort and salvation. For men who have faced the end of a marriage, this is an essential truth.

Feeling isolated can tempt us to seek quick fixes or compromises that ultimately harm. But God's presence invites us to lean into Him instead of turning away. This passage reassures us that vulnerability is not weakness but an opportunity for God's strength to shine.

Consider the power of admitting your pain to God openly today. He meets you where you are and promises His grace, which Paul declares is sufficient exactly when we feel weak and insufficient.

Trust in God's faithful love to sustain you through your brokenness and to guide you into renewed integrity and wholeness.

#### Devotional: The Battle Begins in the Heart

**Sexual integrity begins with guarding the heart.** Proverbs 4:23 teaches us that our inward thoughts and desires shape our outward actions. For men in seasons of loneliness, this means being intentional about what we allow to influence our hearts—whether it's media, conversations, or private thoughts.

Jesus cautioned in Matthew 5:28 against even lustful thoughts, recognizing how quickly the heart can stray. When temptation rises, it often begins with an unchecked desire. James reminds us that yielding to temptation is a process, starting with being drawn by our own desires.

Guarding your heart means cultivating accountability, prayer, and setting clear boundaries. It is not about legalism but about protecting the sacredness of your identity as a man made in God's image, called to live honorably.

Ask God to give you wisdom and courage to safeguard what is most precious inside you.

What concrete steps can you take to guard your heart daily?

# Devotional: Cultivating Self-Control Through the Spirit

Maintaining sexual integrity requires intentional self-control as part of the Fruit of the Spirit. Galatians 5 highlights self-control as a vital spiritual fruit cultivated by the Holy Spirit's work in us.

Paul models this discipline in 1 Corinthians by actively disciplining his body and keeping it under control to avoid disqualification. This example calls every believer to practical measures of self-restraint.

Titus expands this idea by showing grace trains us to reject ungodliness and worldly passions, redirecting desires toward godliness.
