Devotional: The Heart's True Condition and God's Cleansing Power

Your Verse

Day 2: **B** Living with Integrity

Devotional: Embracing Blamelessness Through Integrity and Righteousness

Integrity is a cornerstone of holiness. It means living consistently according to God's truth, both in public and private. Psalm 15 paints a picture of the person who is allowed to dwell in God's presence — one who walks blamelessly and practices righteousness.
