Your Verse

1 John 1:5-7 NIV – "This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin."

Devotional: Living Transparently: Embracing God's Light

Walking in the light is the foundational theme of 1 John 1:5-7. The apostle begins by declaring a profound truth: "God is light; in him there is no darkness at all." This statement sets an unshakeable standard of holiness and purity. To walk in light means to live transparently, openly, and truthfully before God and one another.

Claiming fellowship with God while living in darkness is a contradiction. It challenges us seriously—do our words and actions consistently reflect the truth about our relationship with Christ? Walking in light involves daily repentance and an honest acknowledgement of our sins. Thankfully, the blood of Jesus purifies us, enabling genuine fellowship not only with God but also with fellow believers. This purification is ongoing, a daily cleansing that invites us into freedom and intimacy in our Christian walk.

Walking in the light also means being part of a community that reflects God's purity and love. It challenges us to reject secret sin and hypocrisy and to embody God's character by loving one another sincerely.

Consider: are there areas where darkness still lingers in your life? Are you embracing the cleansing power of Jesus' blood to walk boldly in the light?

Your Verse

1 John 4:7-12 NIV - "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 13:34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."
- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."







Day 2: VP The Command to Love

Devotional: Reflecting God's Love to Others Daily

Love stands at the heart of 1 John, beautifully summed up in chapter 4. John emphasizes that love originates from God and is the defining mark of His children. It is not merely a sentiment or an emotion but a decisive action rooted in God's own nature.

This passage reminds us of the ultimate demonstration of love—God sending His Son, Jesus Christ, as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. This love is unconditional and sacrificial, calling us to mirror it in our relationships with others. Genuine love is the evidence of truly knowing God.

When we love others, we testify to God's presence within us. Conversely, a lack of love betrays spiritual disconnect. The love we extend to one another is a reflection and completion of God's love in us, a tangible expression of divine life touching the world.

Today's challenge lies in internalizing this truth and practicing love intentionally. Love in action often demands humility, forgiveness, and patience. It invites us to step beyond convenience and comfort to serve and care wholeheartedly.

Assurance of Salvation

Your Verse

1 John 5:11-13 NIV - "And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 10:28 "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand."
- Romans 8:38–39 "For I am convinced that neither death nor life... will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."







Day 3: () Assurance of Salvation

Devotional: Living in the Confidence of God's Promise

One of the most comforting themes in 1 John is the assurance of salvation. In 5:11–13, John clearly states that eternal life is a gift given by God and that this life is found only in His Son, Jesus Christ. The certainty of belonging to God and possessing eternal life is what John desires believers to fully grasp.

This assurance is not based on feelings or works but on the objective reality of God's promise and Christ's finished work. When we have Christ, we possess life that transcends time, offering security against doubt and fear.

John's purpose in writing is explicitly to instill confidence so believers do not live in uncertainty. Trusting in Jesus brings peace, joy, and boldness to live as children of God. This assurance also influences how we live—we become empowered by love and truth rather than fear or condemnation.

As you meditate on this passage, consider the ways you rest in God's promise. How does assurance affect your everyday faith and hope? This eternal life begins now and is forever secure.
