

2 Timothy 1:7 makes it clear that God's Spirit empowers us with power, love, and self-discipline — not fear. Boldness combined with wisdom is disciplined, loving, and purposeful.

Proverbs 28:1 contrasts the fear of the wicked with the confident boldness of the righteous. Today, ask God to fill you with wise boldness, enabling you to serve fervently and speak truth courageously in your calling.
