# Walking With God Like Enoch



Explore the life of Enoch, a man who walked so closely with God he was taken without death. Learn to deepen your own walk with God daily.





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#### Introduction

The Bible tells us that Enoch "walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away" (Genesis 5:24). Throughout this study, we invite you to embrace vulnerability in your reflections, to seek a more profound faithfulness, and to open your heart to the transformative power of God's presence. Whether you feel distant or near,







this plan is designed to encourage a fresh and deepened relationship, inspired by Enoch's remarkable example. Let's embark on this journey together, aiming to grow in understanding and love for God.















#### Your Verse

Genesis 5:21–24 – 'When Enoch had lived 65 years, he became the father of Methuselah. After he became the father of Methuselah, Enoch walked faithfully with God 300 years and had other sons and daughters. Altogether, Enoch lived a total of 365 years. Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away.'

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 11:5 'By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death; he could not be found, because God had taken him away.'
- Jude 1:14–15 'Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied about them: "See, the Lord is coming with thousands upon thousands of his holy ones.""







#### Devotional: Enoch's Faithful Walk With God

**Enoch's story is brief but profoundly inspiring.** Within a few verses, Scripture presents him as a man who walked so closely with God that death never touched him. His faithfulness is striking, especially considering the long list of generations before and after him.

What does this mean for us today? The phrase "walked faithfully with God" implies an ongoing, intimate relationship. Enoch's walk was a lifestyle, not a momentary act. We see that after fathering Methuselah, Enoch continued his commitment for 300 more years. This consistency suggests perseverance in faith and daily trust.

Enoch's life reminds us that true faith is marked by relationship, not just ritual or belief. One can live a lifetime with God if one chooses continual fellowship and obedience. The idea that God took him away without seeing death is a profound reward for such dedication.

As we begin this study, may Enoch's example challenge us to examine our own spiritual walk. Are we persistent in our faith? Do we crave nearness to God above all else? Let's seek to grow into a similar closeness as we move forward.

#### Devotional: Obedience: The Path to Intimacy

Walking with God involves more than closeness; it requires obedience. Micah 6:8 calls us to walk humbly with God—a posture of humility that's essential for true fellowship. Enoch's faithful walk surely involved obeying God's commands and living justly.

Walking humbly means acknowledging God's authority and surrendering our own will. It requires us to align our daily decisions with His word—the lamp and light guiding our path (Psalm 119:105). Obedience is not a burden but an expression of love and trust.

Enoch modeled this obedient walk in an era when sin was rampant. His life reminds us that obedience draws us nearer to God. When we choose to obey, we deepen our fellowship and experience His presence more fully.
