Each day includes Scripture readings, devotional reflections, probing questions, journaling prompts, and prayers designed to foster awareness and growth. With biblical wisdom as your guide, you'll be empowered to guard







your heart, deepen your intimacy with Christ, and avoid the tragic path that Judas chose.



Devotional: Recognizing the First Whispers of Temptation

Judas was chosen. He was not an outsider but one intimately trusted by Jesus. Yet, *temptation found its way* into his heart. John 13:2 tells us the devil had already prompted Judas to betray Jesus, showing that temptation often starts silently, long before action is taken.

Spiritual drift begins the moment our hearts entertain thoughts contrary to God's will. Judas faced internal battles we can relate to — greed, dissatisfaction, and doubt. Recognizing these early whispers is critical to stand firm.

Devotional: Guarding Against Hardened, Unrepentant Hearts

Judas' heart became hard and unrepentant, ultimately breaking the relationship he had with Jesus. **Hebrews 3:12 warns** against sinful, unbelieving hearts turning away from God—exactly what occurred in Judas' betrayal. An unrepentant heart is a heart that refuses to confess and turn back to God.

If sins are concealed and not brought before God, they create distance between us and Him. Proverbs 28:13 reminds us of the importance of confession and renunciation. Mercy awaits those who humble themselves and seek God's forgiveness.

Today, examine your heart honestly. Is there any part of you resisting God's call to repent? Genuine repentance leads to restoration and healing. Don't wait until drift becomes betrayal — turn back now with a contrite heart.

Day 3: Day 3: Didentifying Spiritual Drift Early

Devotional: Early Warnings of Forsaken First Love

Judas' betrayal stemmed from a drifting heart, one that slowly "forsook the love they had at first." Revelation 2:4 addresses this pattern of spiritual drift. It is a painful but necessary call to self-examination.

Drift often manifests in diminished love, lost passion for God, and subtle compromises. 2 Timothy 4:10 recounts Demas deserting Paul because he loved the world more, a parallel to Judas' choice driven by worldly gain.

Recognizing spiritual drift *early* is critical before it leads to irreversible loss. Today, ask God to reveal where your heart may be drifting and what first steps you can take to correct your course. Don't wait until distance deepens.

Day 4: <u>M</u> Greed's Role in Betrayal

Devotional: Guarding the Heart Against Greed

Judas' betrayal was motivated, at least in part, by greed and the lure of money. In Matthew 26:15, he bargains for thirty pieces of silver, showing how love for money can corrupt even close followers of Christ.

1 Timothy 6:10 warns that the love of money is a root of many evils. When our hearts set on material gain, we pave a dangerous path leading away from God's purpose. Psalms remind us not to put our trust in ill–gotten riches but to find hope and security in God alone.

Today, evaluate where greed or materialism might be influencing your decisions or priorities. Invite God to cleanse your heart, aligning your desires with His kingdom values. True treasure is found in faithful service and obedience, not in fleeting silver or gold.







Reflect and Apply

Are there areas where material gain tempts me to compromise my faith?
How do I value earthly possessions compared to spiritual riches?
What steps can I take to cultivate generosity and contentment?



Day 5: A Deceit and Hidden Motives

Devotional: Uncovering Hidden Motives and Deceit

Judas' hypocrisy was marked by deceit—even his concern for the poor was a facade (John 12:6). As treasurer, he stole from the common fund, revealing a hidden agenda beneath his outward appearance.

Psalm 55:21 paints a vivid picture of smooth words masking malicious intent, a danger in any spiritual walk. Proverbs lists qualities God hates, including lying and deceit, emphasizing the importance of purity in speech and action.

Today, consider if there are any hidden motives behind your words or actions. Are there areas where you portray faith outwardly but harbor selfish desires internally? Invite God to reveal and purify your intentions so that your life reflects integrity and sincerity.

Day 6: Comfort with Compromise

Devotional: From Regret to Repentance or Ruin

Judas reached a painful moment of remorse after Jesus was condemned, returning the silver in deep regret (Matthew 27:3). His sorrow, however, was not accompanied by true repentance that led to restoration.

James 1:14 explains the process of temptation drawing a person away by enticement of evil desires, a dangerous spiral from compromise to betrayal. Yet 1 John 1:9 offers hope, promising forgiveness when our hearts genuinely confess sins.

Today, reflect on any compromises making you uncomfortable but which you have tolerated. Identify whether your sorrow leads to repentance or leaves you stuck in regret. God invites you to confess and receive His mercy, restoring your heart fully.

2 Chronicles 7:14 describes God's promise to hear and heal when His people humble themselves and turn from wickedness. The parable in Luke 15 reveals the joy in heaven over one repentant sinner, emphasizing repentance as a cause for celebration.

As you continue this study, embrace the call to repentance — not as punishment but as a loving invitation into deeper fellowship, freedom, and joy. God's grace awaits your turning.





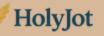

2 Corinthians celebrates new creation—old mistakes washed away, replaced with a fresh start. Isaiah paints a powerful picture of sins turned white as snow, highlighting God's cleansing power.

Are you burdened by past mistakes or ongoing sin? Today, embrace God's redemptive love and freedom. No heart is beyond His repair when opened to genuine faith and surrender.
