# Watching for Spiritual Seasons in the Gospels



Explore key Gospel passages with a focus on Luke 21:29–31 to discern spiritual seasons and recognize God's unfolding plan.





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#### Introduction

Welcome to this three-day journey through the Gospels, where we will learn to watch for spiritual seasons and signs just as Jesus illustrated with the budding fig tree in *Luke 21:29–31*. #### Your Verse

Luke 21:29–31 NIV – 'He told them this parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees. When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near.'"

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Ecclesiastes 3:1 "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."
- Mark 13:28 "Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near."







#### Devotional: Understanding God's Spiritual Timetable

**Jesus uses the fig tree as a vivid illustration** to teach about spiritual seasons and timing. Just as the natural world follows cycles and signals change, our spiritual journeys also move through seasons of growth, waiting, and fulfillment.

*Luke 21:29–31* reminds us to be observant and discerning—when the fig tree buds, summer is near. This parable emphasizes that believers should develop spiritual eyes to detect God's unfolding plan rather than ignoring the signs or living unaware. Recognizing these seasons calls us to be alert and ready for the events God has set in motion, including Jesus' promises and the coming Kingdom.

Sometimes spiritual seasons are marked by renewal and growth; other times by testing and waiting. Paying close attention to God's Word and the movement of the Holy Spirit equips us to respond with faith and obedience. Are you watching for the sprouting leaves—indicators that God's promises are about to be fulfilled in your life?

Let this encourage you today to seek sensitivity to the timing God is working. Trust that He is purposefully leading you through every season for your growth and His glory.

# Day 2: Watching for Signs of the Kingdom









#### Your Verse

Matthew 24:32–33 NIV – "Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. Even so, when you see all these things, you know that it is near, right at the door."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Luke 21:25–28 "There will be signs in the sun, moon and stars. On the earth, nations will be in anguish... But when these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."
- Romans 8:25 "But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently."







#### Devotional: Spiritual Readiness and Hope

The Gospels invite us not only to identify seasons but to watch for the signs accompanying God's kingdom breaking into the world.

In *Matthew 24:32–33*, Jesus draws our attention to observable signs that signal the nearness of God's promises. These signs include both natural and supernatural events that testify to God's sovereignty and plan. Such awareness nurtures hopeful expectancy rather than fear or complacency.

Being spiritually ready means living with hopeful patience and confidence. The Apostle Paul reminds us in *Romans 8:25* that hope requires waiting, but it is an active, expectant waiting rather than passive delay. Watching for signs strengthens our faith and reminds us that redemption is coming.

Consider how you react when you notice signs of God moving in your life or the world around you. Do they increase your peace and trust? The call is to stand firm and lift your head, knowing your redemption—the ultimate fulfillment of God's promises—is drawing near.

May this truth encourage you to live a life marked by hope, readiness, and joyful anticipation of God's kingdom.

#### Your Verse

John 15:4–5 NIV – "Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine... I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Galatians 5:22–23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace... against such things there is no law."
- Psalm 1:3 "That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season."

# Devotional: Fruitfulness Through Connection to Christ

**As we watch and wait for God's timing,** the Gospels remind us that true fruitfulness depends on staying deeply connected to Jesus.

In *John 15:4–5*, Jesus describes Himself as the vine and His followers as branches. Without connection to Him, we wither; abiding in Him produces abundant fruit regardless of season or circumstance. The spiritual seasons we experience all serve to refine and mature us.

*Psalm 1:3* beautifully expresses that a life rooted in God nourishes fruitfulness in its proper time. Likewise, the fruit of the Spirit listed in *Galatians 5:22–23* shows how God's transforming work manifests in our character and actions.

Whether in times of waiting, growth, or challenge, staying connected to Christ enables us to bear fruit that glorifies God and blesses others. Reflect on your own connection with Jesus today — are you abiding in Him and relying on His strength to remain fruitful through every season?

Let us commit to the vine so we can thrive and be a blessing, no matter what spiritual season we are facing.
