#### Your Verse

- Hebrews 10:24-25 "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together..."







#### Devotional: God's Design for Meaningful Connection

#### Your Verse

1 Corinthians 13:4–7 – "Love is patient, love is kind... It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- John 13:34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."
- Colossians 3:14 "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

#### Devotional: Living Out Patient, Kind Love Daily

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#### Prayer for Today

Ephesians 4:32 – "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







#### Devotional: The Freedom and Power of Forgiving

**Forgiveness is essential to sustaining biblical community.** Our relationships will inevitably experience hurt, misunderstandings, and offenses. The call to forgive reflects God's immense grace toward us.

Choosing forgiveness doesn't minimize pain but unlocks freedom for both parties and honors God's heart. It restores broken bonds and fosters healing where bitterness would otherwise take root.

Embracing forgiveness requires humility and compassion—qualities Jesus modeled perfectly. Remember, when we forgive, we imitate God's mercy and uphold the unity of the Spirit.

Today, prayerfully consider those you may need to forgive or seek forgiveness from, and lean into God's strength to do so.

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#### **Journaling Prompts**

Write a letter of forgiveness (you don't have to send it) to someone who has hurt you.
Reflect on a time when someone forgave you—how did it impact your relationship?
Ask God to show you any bitterness you need to release and journal His response.







#### Prayer for Today

**Lord Jesus,** thank You for the forgiveness You freely give. Help me to extend that same grace to others. Soften my heart toward those I find hard to forgive. Give me the courage and humility to seek reconciliation where possible. May Your peace reign in all my relationships, and may I walk in freedom through forgiveness. #### Your Verse

- Mark 10:45 "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve."
- Galatians 5:13 "Serve one another humbly in love."

#### Devotional: The Heart of Humble Service

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- James 1:19 "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry."







#### Devotional: Honest, Loving Communication Builds Community

**Effective communication is vital for healthy biblical community.** Speaking truth in love means sharing honesty with gentleness and care.

This balance nurtures growth, deepens trust, and avoids destructive conflict. Scripture encourages us to be quick listeners and slow to anger, practicing patience and grace.
