Introduction

Relationships are some of the most beautiful yet complex parts of our lives. They bring joy, support, and growth, but also challenges that test our character deeply. Sometimes, the hardest reality to face is that *we* might be the difficult person in a relationship. This 21-day study is designed for anyone willing to humbly look inward, confront pride, selfishness, or control issues, and seek God's guidance in healing these broken connections.

We often want better relationships, but without personal change, the cycle of conflict and hurt continues. This plan encourages honest self-examination through Scripture, prayer, and reflection. You'll be invited to consider what the Bible says about humility, love, forgiveness, and servanthood—and apply these truths where they matter most.

Each day includes a Scripture passage to inspire and guide, alongside devotional insights that help reveal the heart's condition and offer practical wisdom. You'll find reflection questions and journaling prompts to foster deep personal growth as you seek God's help. Prayer is woven throughout, calling on His Spirit to transform pride into humility, control into surrender, and selfishness into selflessness.

This journey isn't easy. Facing ourselves can be uncomfortable, even painful. But God's love is patient and powerful to heal all wounds. As you surrender your heart during these 21 days, trust that He will meet you with grace and restore your capacity to love well—starting with yourself. Prepare to be







challenged, encouraged, and renewed. Your relationships can be a witness to God's redeeming power when healing begins from within.









Day 1: **■** Facing the Mirror









Your Verse

Psalm 139:23-24 NIV - "Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

Supporting Scriptures

- Lamentations 3:40 "Let us examine our ways and test them, and let us return to the Lord."
- 2 Corinthians 13:5 "Test yourselves to see if you are in the faith; examine yourselves."







Devotional: Invite God to Reveal Your Heart Today

To begin change, we must first be willing to look honestly at ourselves. Psalm 139:23–24 models a prayer of openness where David asks God to search his heart and reveal any hidden offenses or sinful attitudes. This requires humility—acknowledging we may be wrong even when it's uncomfortable.

Reflect on what 'the mirror' of God's Word reveals in your heart. What do you resist admitting? Pride, control, or selfish motives may lurk beneath your actions or words in relationships. Instead of blaming others, invite God to show you where you have caused pain or conflict.

This first step is one of surrender—allowing God to lead you in the way everlasting means turning away from destructive patterns. It's not about shame but about healing and restoration.

2.	What specific attitudes or actions could God be wanting to reveal to you?
	How do you usually respond to conflict—do you see any patterns linked to pride or control?

Prayer for Today

Father, I come before You with an open heart, asking You to search me and reveal anything in me that causes harm to others or myself. Please give me the courage to face uncomfortable truths and the grace to accept Your correction. Help me choose Your way of humility and love instead of pride or control. Lead me gently into healing and transform my heart to reflect Your perfect love. *Thank You for never giving up on me.* Amen. \bigwedge

















Day 2: Acknowledge the Problem

Your Verse

Proverbs 28:13 NIV – "Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us."
- James 5:16 "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed."







Day 2: Acknowledge the Problem

Devotional: Confession Opens the Door to Mercy

Recognition and confession are powerful steps toward healing. Proverbs 28:13 reminds us that hiding our faults only prolongs brokenness, but openly acknowledging them invites God's mercy. It can be tempting to make excuses or justify our behavior, but honest confession releases the chains of pride and opens the door for transformation.

In relationships, admitting our role in conflict—even if it's uncomfortable—is an act of courage and love. It disrupts the cycle of blame and defensiveness, allowing healing to begin. When we confess, we also position ourselves to receive God's forgiveness and the forgiving love of others.

Today, identify and name specific attitudes or actions that have made you a difficult person in your relationships. Let God's mercy overshadow your fear of judgment.

1.	What feelings come up when you consider confessing your faults to God or others?
2.	Which specific behaviors in your relationships have you been unwilling to admit?
3.	How might confessing these open a path toward restoration?

- Romans 12:10 "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves."
- 1 Corinthians 13:5 "Love...does not dishonor others, it is not selfseeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs."







Day 3:
Seeing Through God's Eyes

Devotional: Choose to Value Others Above Yourself

Transformation in relationships begins when we shift our perspective from self-centeredness to others-centeredness. Philippians 2:3 challenges us to reject selfish ambition and instead value others above ourselves. This requires us to actively see people through God's compassionate eyes—recognizing their worth, struggles, and dignity.

When you consider your role as the difficult person, ask yourself if your actions reflected valuing others or only your own preferences. Pride often blinds us to how our words or behavior affect those we love. By asking God to help you see others as He does, you invite empathy that softens hearts and cultivates humility.

Practice praying for the individuals causing tension in your relationships, asking God to bless them and reveal their value to you.

- 1 Peter 5:5 "All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another."







Day 4: 7 Cultivating Humility

Devotional: Embrace God's Grace Through Humble Living

Humility is the antidote to pride—the root cause of many relational conflicts. James 4:6 reminds us that God resists the proud but extends grace to the humble. Cultivating humility involves surrendering control, admitting we don't have all the answers, and valuing others sincerely.

Walking humbly means depending on God daily and relating to others with gentleness and respect. It softens our hearts and opens the door for reconciliation. Humility isn't weakness; it's strength under God's authority that leads to freedom.

Consider areas where pride has kept you from yielding or admitting wrong. Invite God's grace to nurture humility in your heart today.

Day 5: Paraming the Tongue









Your Verse

James 3:5-6 NIV - "The tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."
- Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up."







Devotional: Harness Your Words for Healing

Our words can heal or harm, build up or destroy relationships. James vividly compares the tongue to a small fire capable of great destruction. When we are the difficult person, we may use harsh words, sarcasm, or controlling speech that wounds others deeply.

Controlling our speech is vital in restoring trust and love. It requires selfawareness and reliance on God's Spirit to replace harshness with gentleness and encouragement.

Evaluate the way you communicate in tense moments. Are your words reflective of love and respect, or do they stoke conflict? Pray today for the Holy Spirit to discipline your tongue and equip you to build others up.

2	What triggers cause you to speak harshly or defensively?

Father, I ask You to help me control my tongue. Guard my speech so it does not cause pain or division but brings healing and encouragement. Teach me to respond with gentleness and grace, reflecting Your love in every word. Amen.

















Your Verse

James 1:19 NIV – "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 18:13 "To answer before listening—that is folly and shame."
- Ecclesiastes 3:7 "A time to be silent and a time to speak."







Devotional: Love Speaks Loudest When You Listen

Listening is one of the most radical acts of love we can offer in relationships. James calls us to be quick to listen and slow to speak—countering the tendency to defend ourselves or interrupt when tensions rise.

Being the difficult person often means wanting to control conversations or pushing our own agenda. True healing begins when we pause and genuinely listen, showing respect for the other person's feelings and perspective.

Today, focus on cultivating the discipline of active listening. Give people your full attention and resist the urge to interrupt or formulate your response before they finish. This humility opens doors for empathy and understanding.







Reflect and Apply

1.	How well do you listen in your relationships? What gets in the way?
2.	Recall a time when listening helped resolve conflict—what did you learn?
3.	How can improved listening reduce control struggles in your interactions?

1.	Describe your typical listening habits and how you want to improve.

Lord, teach me to be quick to listen and slow to speak. Help me set aside my need to control conversations and instead hear others with empathy. Open my heart to understand before responding, and fill me with patience and grace. Amen.









Day 7: V Letting Go of Offense









Your Verse

Ephesians 4:31–32 NIV – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







Devotional: Release Bitterness Through Forgiveness

Harboring offense feeds bitterness and destroys peace in relationships.

Ephesians urges us to rid ourselves of anger and embrace kindness and forgiveness as God has forgiven us in Christ. But when we are the difficult person, we may hold tightly to grievances, refusing to release control or admit wrongdoing.

Choosing to let go of offenses is a courageous act of obedience and freedom. Forgiveness doesn't mean forgetting, but surrendering the right to retaliate or keep score. It invites God's healing in both our hearts and relationships.

Reflect on the offenses you hold onto today—especially those that may be kept alive by pride or self-justification. Ask God for grace to forgive and break the cycle of bitterness.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What offenses or grudges are you holding that fuel relational tension?
2.	How does pride make it difficult to forgive or admit fault?
3.	What steps can you take to begin releasing these offenses?







Journaling Prompts

1.	List specific offenses you need to forgive—include yourself if necessary.
2.	Write a prayer surrendering bitterness and asking for a forgiving heart.
	Describe how forgiveness might change your relationships moving forward.

Jesus, I ask for Your strength to forgive those who have hurt me—and to forgive myself. Help me release bitterness and anger that poison my heart. Fill me with Your compassion and kindness, enabling me to walk in freedom and love. Amen. 🙏 💝 😂 🥬

Devotional: Trust and Release Your Grip on Control

Control can feel safe, but it often creates walls in relationships. Proverbs reminds us to trust the Lord fully and not depend on our limited understanding or attempts to manage everything. Surrendering control is an act of faith that God will lead us wisely.

Admitting we don't have all the answers is difficult for the prideful heart. But yielding our will opens space for God's peace and guidance.

Today, reflect on areas where you cling tightly to control—whether through manipulation, rigid expectations, or defensiveness. Ask God to teach you to surrender and trust Him with the outcomes, knowing He desires good for you and your relationships.

1.	In what ways do you try to control people or situations?
2.	What fears drive your need for control?
3.	How can trusting God alter the need to control outcomes?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about moments you struggled to let go of control in relationships.

Day 9: Selflessness in Action









Your Verse

Philippians 2:4 NIV – "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others."

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 5:13 "Serve one another humbly in love."
- Romans 15:2 "Each of us should please our neighbors for their good, to build them up."







Devotional: Choosing Others' Needs Before Your Own

Selfishness fractures relationships; selflessness binds them. Philippians calls us to consider others' interests alongside our own—a radical shift from 'me first' to 'others first.'

Living as the difficult person often means acting from self-interest without awareness of impact. Practicing selflessness requires intentional acts of kindness, patience, and sacrifice.

Ask God to help you replace selfish habits with generosity in thought, words, and deeds. Genuine concern for others' well-being transforms hearts and fosters closeness.







Reflect and Apply

1.	Where have you prioritized your wants over others in relationships?
2.	How does selflessness challenge your usual behavior?
3.	What small acts of service can you offer to those you struggle with?

1.	Write about opportunities to practice selflessness this week.

Luke 17:3-4 NIV - "If your brother or sister sins against you, rebuke them; and if they repent, forgive them. Even if they sin against you seven times in a day and seven times come back to you saying 'I repent,' you must forgive them."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 5:23–24 "First be reconciled to your brother or sister...then come and offer your gift."
- Proverbs 16:24 "Gracious words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones."







Devotional: Steps to Restore What Pride Has Broken

When we are the difficult person, trust often suffers and must be intentionally rebuilt. Luke 17 emphasizes repentance and forgiveness as essential for restoration. Taking responsibility for our wrongs and showing consistent repentance opens the door to renewed trust.

The process requires humility and patience. Repair is not instant but nurtured by gracious words, honest actions, and God's healing presence.

Today, consider steps to rebuild trust where you have caused hurt. Are you ready to repent genuinely? Ask God to empower your efforts and soften others' hearts.

How has pride damaged trust in your relationships?
Are you willing to repent and seek forgiveness honestly?
What practical steps can you take to demonstrate change?

When you're the difficult person, your mindset shapes your choices and reactions. Renewing your mind means immersing yourself regularly in Scripture and prayer, replacing false beliefs with God's wisdom.

Commit today to feed your mind with God's promises about your identity, purpose, and how to love others well. This spiritual renewal fuels lasting change in your relationships.

Day 12: SP Embracing Grace for Yourself

Devotional: Rest in God's Grace and Strength

Facing that we are the difficult person can bring deep shame and discouragement. But God's grace is sufficient, even in our weakness and faults. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians invite us to boast in our weaknesses because they reveal God's power to transform.

Embracing grace for yourself is essential before you can extend it to others. Accept God's forgiveness and love fully, leaving behind self-condemnation. Healing relationships begins by resting in God's strength, not your own efforts.

Remember that God removes your sins completely and renews you daily. Today, receive His grace deeply and allow it to fuel your journey of change.

Devotional: Choose Forgiveness and Patience Today

Just as God extends grace to us, we are called to extend it to others—especially when we're difficult. Colossians 3:13 challenges us to forgive repeatedly, modeling the boundless forgiveness God offers.

Extending grace means choosing patience, humility, and love in the face of hurt or disappointment. It softens hearts and restores broken bonds.

Commit to seeing others through the lens of grace today, remembering how much you've been forgiven. When conflicts arise, respond with forgiveness rather than resentment.

Devotional: Allow God's Peace to Steady Your Heart

Inner peace is crucial for healthy relationships and overcoming difficulty within ourselves. Jesus promises a peace unlike the world's—a peace that calms troubled hearts and dispels fear.

When pride, control, or selfishness stir unrest inside, it affects how we relate to others. Cultivating God's peace starts with trusting Him amid uncertainty and conflict.

Spend time today meditating on God's promises of peace. Practice quiet moments of surrender to calm your heart and mind, letting God's peace guard your relationships.
