Wisdom is not merely knowledge but living skillfully in God's fear, honoring Him above selfish desires. Let us learn to discern how to handle conflicts without







succumbing to greed, allowing God's Spirit to produce fruit of righteousness in every action.

















Your Verse

1 Timothy 6:10 - "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 15:27 "The greedy bring ruin to their households, but the one who hates bribes will live."
- Luke 12:15 "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."







Devotional: Recognizing Greed's Danger in Our Hearts

Greed often begins subtly, enticing the heart with promising gain. Even believers can find themselves drawn into pursuing more—not just possessions but victories in disputes and lawsuits. *1 Timothy 6:10* clearly states that love of money can lead believers astray, resulting in deep pain and loss of faith.

As we open our eyes today, it is critical to identify how greed's grip can twist our motives, especially when conflicts arise. Legal battles or lawsuits are often justified as seeking justice, but when greed clouds this pursuit, the quest becomes self-serving rather than God-honoring.

Proverbs 15:27 warns us that greed can bring ruin not only in a personal sense but also harm those closest to us. We are called to hate bribery and greed, cultivating integrity instead. Jesus' words in *Luke 12:15* poignantly remind us that life's true value isn't measured by what we gain materially or in legal victories but by our relationship with God and how we reflect His character.

Devotional: Balancing Justice with Mercy in Disputes

God's ideal for believers who face conflict or legal issues is beautifully summarized in *Micah 6:8*. He calls us not only to act justly but also to love mercy and walk humbly with Him. These three demands guard against greed by focusing our hearts on God's righteousness rather than personal gain.

Justice is central—seeking what is right and true. Yet Scripture places mercy alongside justice, reminding us that rigid judgment without love can become harsh and self–serving. *Proverbs 21:3* emphasizes God's preference for righteous action over mere rituals or sacrifice, signaling that how we live out justice reflects our faithfulness to Him.

James 2:13 exhorts us to let mercy conquer our tendencies to judge harshly. In disputes, this means prioritizing empathy, forgiveness, and peace even when standing for truth. Walking humbly with God shapes our motives and keeps pride and greed in check.

Today, meditate on balancing justice with mercy in your approach to conflicts, trusting God's wisdom as your guide away from selfish ambition.

Devotional: Living Blamelessly in Conflict through Integrity

When lawsuits or conflicts challenge us, **integrity** is our strongest defense. *Psalm 15:1–2* paints integrity as living blamelessly, doing what is right, and speaking truth authentically from the heart. Holding fast to these standards protects us from the corrupting influence of greed.

Proverbs 10:9 highlights the security that integrity brings—in stark contrast to the inevitable consequences of deceit or crookedness. Even when legal systems tempt us to bend truth to gain advantage, God calls us to unwavering honesty.

2 Corinthians 8:21 reminds believers to pursue what is right visibly—to both God and others. In a culture where greed can pervade lawsuits, seeking approval from God above all keeps our motives pure.

Ask yourself today: how does your integrity shine or waver in conflict? Pray for God's strength to stand firm, speaking truth and living righteously no matter the circumstances.

Your Verse

- Romans 12:18 "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."

Devotional: Choosing Humility Over Selfish Ambition

Humility is a vital guard against greed and selfish ambition in disputes. *Philippians 2:3–4* calls us to reject boasting or selfishness and to value others highly, focusing on their needs, not merely our own. Devotional: Guarding Against Bribery and Corruption

Corruption strikes at the heart of righteous conflict resolution. *Exodus 23:8* cautions believers not to accept bribes, for greed blinds our judgment and twists truth. In legal disputes, the temptation to manipulate facts or sway decisions for gain threatens not only fairness but our relationship with God.

Devotional: Living as God's Peacemaker in Every Situation
