Devotional: Training Ourselves to Discern Truth

We live in a time of spiritual deception, where false teachings and prophets seek to confuse the body of Christ. **Discernment is a vital skill for believers today**—the ability to test teachings and spirits, separating truth from lies.

Luke encourages believers to pray for strength to endure and to stand firm. Prayer and watchfulness go hand in hand, strengthening our spiritual defenses and sharpening our understanding.

Staying alert means cultivating a lifestyle of prayer, study, and obedience to God's Word. It means living with an eternal perspective and resisting complacency or distraction.

Your Verse

Day 4: Wisdom to Interpret Signs

Devotional: Seeing Clearly Through God's Lens

Jesus rebukes the crowd for their inability to discern the spiritual realities behind current events, despite their skill in understanding natural signs. Likewise, we are challenged to develop the wisdom to correctly interpret the signs of our times.

The book of Daniel highlights the contrast between the wise and the wicked —those who understand what God is doing and those who don't. It also reminds us that wisdom often comes through refining trials.

Revelation encourages us to seek spiritual riches that enable us to 'anoint our eyes,' a metaphor for receiving clarity and insight. This spiritual vision is essential in an age of confusion and deception.

Wisdom to interpret signs requires a humble heart, a refined spirit, and dependence on God's guidance. It is not about fear or speculation, but about discernment empowered by faith.
