#### Your Verse

Proverbs 9:10 – "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding."

- Psalm 111:10 "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding."
- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault."







#### Devotional: Start with Reverence for God

Wisdom begins with reverence for God. This foundational truth anchors all our decisions, especially when choosing someone to represent us in matters of justice. The fear of the Lord is not about terror but a deep respect and acknowledgment of His authority.

#### Devotional: Seek Justice Above All

**Justice is at the core of God's heart.** When considering an advocate, we must look beyond skill and reputation to the condition of their heart. Proverbs 21:3 reminds us that God values righteousness and justice even more than religious rituals.

A God-fearing advocate is committed to doing what is right, not merely winning a case for personal gain. They defend the weak, uphold fairness, and display mercy.

Ask whether your chosen advocate values justice as God defines it. Do they champion the vulnerable? Are they humble and merciful? Legal systems may sometimes tempt advocates towards favoritism or compromise, but a faithful advocate reflects God's unwavering standard.

#### Devotional: Ask God for Clear Discerning

#### Devotional: Integrity: The Advocate's Mark

#### Devotional: Pursue God's Justice with Confidence
