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Introduction

Each day invites you to meditate on Scripture, ask deep questions, journal your thoughts, and bring your heart honestly before God in prayer. Whether you're facing your own end-of-life decisions or supporting loved ones, these devotions will equip you to embrace this season with courage and clarity.

Allow God's Word to be a lamp to your feet and a light on your path (**Psalm 119:105**) as you seek His wisdom for these sacred moments. May you find peace in His presence and strength in His promises throughout this journey.















Your Verse

James 1:5 – "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."
- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."







Devotional: Ask God Boldly for Guidance and Peace

When facing difficult decisions about the end of life, the first step is to seek God's wisdom. Our human perspective is limited and often clouded by emotion or fear, but God offers wisdom freely to those who ask. James encourages us not to rely solely on ourselves but to approach God with confidence, knowing He will provide clear, generous guidance.

Proverbs reminds us to trust the Lord fully and not lean on our own understanding because His ways are higher. As you prepare to face end-of-life decisions, rest in God as your refuge—even in moments of uncertainty and vulnerability. His strength supports you, and His wisdom is your unwavering guide.

Take a moment to pause and invite God into your thoughts and fears. Ask Him to reveal the path ahead with clarity and peace. Remember, you are never alone; His presence surrounds you as an ever-present help through every trial.

Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."







Devotional: Trading Anxiety for God's Perfect Peace

End-of-life decisions often bring anxiety and fear, but God promises a peace far beyond human comprehension. Paul encourages us to turn anxiety into prayer—bringing every concern before God with thanksgiving. This attitude invites God's peace to actively guard our hearts and minds like a fortress.

Isaiah highlights the link between steadfast minds and perfect peace—showing us that a heart fixed on trusting God stays anchored amid uncertainty. Jesus' words in John further reassure us that His peace is not like the fleeting peace the world offers. It is steady, calming, and unshakable.

As you wrestle with decisions and emotions, practice bringing each worry and question into God's presence through prayer and gratitude. Trust that His peace will guard your emotions and illuminate your path. This peace does not erase difficulty but empowers you to face it without fear or trembling.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What anxieties am I holding onto that I can surrender to God today?
2.	How does God's peace differ from worldly peace in my experience?
3.	In what ways can I practice thanksgiving even in difficult moments?

1.	Write about fears that God's peace has helped ease in your life.
2.	List things you can pray about instead of worrying.
3.	Reflect on a scripture verse that brings you comfort and why.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, thank You for Your peace that calms my troubled heart. Help me to bring every fear and worry to You in prayer, trusting You to guard and protect my mind. Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 32:8 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you."
- Isaiah 30:21 "Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, 'This is the way; walk in it.'"







Devotional: Hearing God's Voice Amid Choices

End-of-life decisions often involve complex and heart-wrenching choices. God promises not only wisdom but understanding and counsel when we seek Him. Proverbs reminds us that true wisdom—knowledge and understanding—comes directly from the Lord.

Psalm 32 and Isaiah 30 emphasize God's personal guidance, teaching us step by step and providing clear direction even when paths seem uncertain. This discernment is critical as you weigh options regarding care, legacy, and closure. It requires quieting distractions and tuning deeply into God's voice.

Be still and listen. Ask God to illuminate the best path and grant clarity in decision–making moments. Remember that God's counsel is always rooted in love and truth, leading toward peace rather than confusion or haste.







Reflect and Apply

Am I setting aside time for quiet reflection to hear God's guidance?
How do I distinguish God's voice from fear, guilt, or pressure?
What past experiences affirm that God guides me clearly?

- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Day 4: **B** Finding Strength in God's Presence

Devotional: God's Strength Carries Us Through Weakness

Facing the later seasons of life often brings physical, emotional, and spiritual weakness. Yet God's promises remind us that His strength is made perfect in our weakness. Isaiah's words assure us that we do not face fear or despair alone because the Lord is present to strengthen, help, and uphold us.

David's honesty in Psalm 73 reveals an enduring truth: though our own strength and hearts may falter, God remains our eternal portion and source of strength. Likewise, Paul reveals God's grace is enough to meet every frailty and limitation.

Draw near to God's presence and find fresh strength for each day. Even when your body or spirit feels weak, His power can sustain you. Trust that His faithful hand supports your journey every step.

Embracing God's timing means surrendering control. It calls us to rest in faith, knowing He directs every moment purposefully. This perspective gives peace amidst change and loss, inviting us to live fully in each season with hope and trust.
