Day 1: Z Embrace Humble Beginnings

Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 4:6 "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."
- Micah 6:8 "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."







Day 1: Z Embrace Humble Beginnings

Devotional: Start with Trust and Humility in Success

Success is exciting, but it can quickly become a trap if we forget where our strength truly comes from. Proverbs reminds us to trust God fully, even when the path forward isn't clear. When God blesses us with promotions or achievements, the first step is to *embrace humility* rather than lean on our own limited understanding.

James warns that pride draws opposition from God, but humility invites His favor. Even when we're elevated, God calls us to maintain a teachable spirit and a servant's heart. Taking time to submit to God daily lays the foundation for handling success well.

Reflect on your current season. Are you tempted to boast or to trust yourself alone? Or do you lean into God's wisdom, knowing He guides faithfully? Choose today to walk humbly, remembering that each step of promotion is by His grace, not your merit.

Your Verse

Proverbs 16:18 - "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 10:12 "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!"
- Psalm 10:4 "In his pride the wicked man does not seek him; in all his thoughts there is no room for God."







Devotional: Wise to Guard Against Pride's Danger

When God blesses us with success, the enemy often attacks through pride.

Proverbs warns that pride precedes destruction, highlighting the danger of a haughty spirit. It might feel natural to boast or feel self-sufficient, but such an attitude blinds us to our need for God.

Paul's words in 1 Corinthians remind us to remain vigilant. Success can lull us into a false sense of security, making us vulnerable to a fall. Psalm 10 reveals that pride can push God out of our hearts entirely, leaving us lost despite outward achievement.

Guarding our hearts against pride requires intentional humility. This means regularly checking our motives, confessing prideful thoughts, and remembering that all good things come from God. Success isn't a platform for self-exaltation but an opportunity to magnify God's faithfulness.

Ask God to help you recognize pride's subtle whispers and to empower you to walk in humble dependence.

Prayer for Today

Lord, protect me from the deceit of pride. When blessings come, guard my heart so I do not exalt myself but honor You instead. Give me awareness to detect pride's subtle creep and the humility to confess and repent. Keep me steady in Your truth and dependent on Your grace every day. May I walk securely, trusting only in You. Day 3: 6 Stay Grounded in God's Word

Your Verse

Psalm 1:3 - "That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 7:24 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."
- Colossians 2:6-7 "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness."







Day 3: 6 Stay Grounded in God's Word

Devotional: Root Your Success Firmly in Scripture

Wisdom for handling success requires deep roots in God's living Word. Psalm 1 paints a beautiful picture of a person whose life is nourished and sustained by God's truth, resulting in stability and fruitfulness in every season.

Jesus emphasized the importance of not just hearing but applying His words. Like a wise builder who constructs on a solid foundation, our success will stand firm if our lives rest on God's Word.

Paul encourages us in Colossians to remain rooted and built up in Christ, growing stronger in faith and overflowing with gratitude. When we stay grounded in scripture, we're less likely to be swayed by the fleeting temptations of pride or anxiety that often accompany success.

Make God's Word your anchor. Let it nurture humility, wisdom, and perseverance so your prosperity honors God and blesses others.

- Proverbs 11:25 "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed."
- Matthew 20:26 "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant."







Day 4: Veg Wisdom to Serve Others

Devotional: Steward Success by Serving Others

Handling success wisely involves a posture of selfless service. Paul's letter to the Philippians urges humility and looking out for others' interests, not just our own. This counters the temptation to become self-focused or complacent in blessing.

Proverbs teaches that generosity brings prosperity and refreshment, suggesting that success is best stewarded when it flows outward, blessing others. Jesus modeled servant leadership, showing that true greatness comes from serving, not ruling.

When God promotes you, it's an opportunity to uplift others, share resources, and influence for good. Such a mindset keeps your heart grounded and magnifies God's kingdom, not just your own comfort.

Reflect on ways your success can amplify others' success, and pray for a servant's heart to steward your favor wisely.

Your Verse

Matthew 6:19–21 – "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth... But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:2 "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things."
- Ecclesiastes 5:10 "Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income."







Day 5: Keep an Eternal Perspective

Devotional: Focus on Eternal Treasures, Not Earthly Wealth

Success often tempts us to focus on earthly treasures, but Jesus calls us to pursue eternal riches. Matt 6 reminds us not to hoard material wealth, which is vulnerable to decay and loss. Instead, we are invited to invest in heavenly treasures—acts of faith, love, and obedience to God.

Paul's encouragement in Colossians points us to fix our minds on eternal realities rather than the temporary success and pleasures of this world. Solomon's observations in Ecclesiastes highlight the futility of chasing wealth without spiritual focus—we are never truly satisfied apart from God.

When God blesses you with material or positional success, remember to weigh your heart's desires in light of eternity. Invest in what will last, and allow your success to foster a deeper relationship with God and others rather than just personal gain.

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."
- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives."







Devotional: Cultivate God's Peace in Seasons of Success

Promotion and success can bring stress, responsibility, and fear of losing favor. Paul's encouragement in Philippians reminds us to combat anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving, entrusting our worries to God. This practice unlocks divine peace that surpasses human understanding.

Isaiah promises perfect peace to those who fix their minds on God, and Jesus affirms this peace as a unique gift from Him, different from what the world offers.

As God blesses and elevates you, intentionally cultivate peace through prayer and trust. This strength will sustain you through challenges and keep your heart steady despite pressures. Let God's peace be your constant companion, guarding you as you navigate new heights.

Your Verse

James 1:5 - "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 37:5 "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this."
- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."







Devotional: Ask, Commit, and Renew Your Strength

As this study concludes, take time to reflect on what God has taught you about wisdom and success. James invites us to ask God for wisdom generously, a promise assurance for those seeking His guidance.

Commit your ways to the Lord, trusting that He will continue to direct every step of your journey. When challenges arise, remember Isaiah's reassurance that those who hope in the Lord will be renewed and empowered to soar above adversity.

Wisdom for handling success is a continual journey of dependence and recommitment. Let this day be an opportunity to realign your heart with God's will, ask for His wisdom, and embrace His strength for all that lies ahead.

Walk forward grounded, humble, and confident—not in your own power but in God's faithful guidance.
