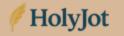












Your Verse

Devotional: Choose Words That Build Up and Encourage

Our words carry power—they can build up or tear down. Ephesians 4:29 provides a clear command for believers: the speech we share must be wholesome, encouraging, and tailored to uplift.

Online, words can easily be misunderstood or misused. The anonymity and distance social media provides sometimes tempt people to be harsh or careless. Yet, Proverbs 15:1 reminds us that a gentle answer diffuses anger, while harsh words provoke strife.

Reflecting on Philippians 4:8, the content we share—posts, comments, messages—should be rooted in truth and purity, focusing on what is noble and praiseworthy. This means avoiding gossip, slander, or content that may harm.

Speak with intention and kindness online. Remember every post and comment has an impact. Will your words encourage growth, offer hope, or build community? Or will they spread division and pain?

Ask God to help you communicate with love and clarity, using social media to be a messenger of His grace.

Devotional: Guard Your Heart with Godly Boundaries

Guarding your heart is critical in an age of constant online stimulation and influence. Proverbs 4:23 reminds believers that our hearts direct life's course. Social media can flood our hearts with negativity, temptation, and comparisons if we are not careful.

1 Corinthians 15:33 warns that bad company can erode good character. Online, this means curating who and what influences us—unfollowing accounts that incite bitterness or promote ungodly behavior is an act of wisdom. Psalm 101:3 exemplifies David's commitment to avoid anything vile or faithless, showing that setting firm boundaries protects our spiritual health.

Practical boundaries might include limiting screen time, avoiding divisive topics, or choosing to engage only in constructive conversations. Boundaries don't mean fear or isolation but wisdom in guarding what we allow into our hearts and minds.
