#### Devotional: Pursue Wisdom Relentlessly

Proverbs reveals the impact leadership has on the whole community, showing how wise leaders bring blessing and corrupt ones bring suffering.

If you're a leader or aspire to be one, reflect on whether your leadership is marked by wisdom and godly character. Leadership maturity grows as we depend on God's wisdom to guide and serve.
