Devotional: Begin with a Humble Request for Wisdom

Begin your journey by humbly asking God to grant you the wisdom to navigate these challenges. Reflect on your motives and examine whether your actions honor God and promote reconciliation rather than division.

Devotional: Pursue Justice with Integrity and Humility

Devotional: Choose Peace as Your Path Forward

Peace is not weakness, but a powerful testimony to God's work within us. It also reflects holiness—living set apart by God's Spirit—and draws others to Christ. In ministry conflicts, may we be diligent peacemakers who seek to restore rather than divide.
