We will learn from biblical examples and practical teachings that help us embrace humility, trust God's sovereignty, and glorify Him more than winning our case. Prepare your heart to explore the liberating power of surrender, and let God's wisdom guide your steps in every conflict and conversation.

# Devotional: Embracing God's Humble, Peaceful Wisdom

**True wisdom**, as the Bible teaches, is far more than human cleverness. James reminds us that godly wisdom is pure, peace-loving, and *submissive*. This kind of wisdom causes us to release our stubborn hold on being right for the sake of peace and humility.

Often, our desire to be right stems from pride and fear, not a genuine pursuit of truth. Holding on to our 'right' can cloud our judgment and create division. But when we embrace heavenly wisdom, we choose to prioritize relationships and God's glory above our own agenda.

Today, invite God to shift your understanding of wisdom. Ask Him to help you see surrender not as losing control but as gaining spiritual insight and peace. As you let go, you allow God's wisdom to flow through you, transforming how you handle conflict and discussions.

# Devotional: Finding Strength in Patience and Self-Control

**Letting go of control** is often one of the hardest parts of surrender. We want to win, to be right, to have our way. But the Bible teaches patience and selfcontrol as marks of true strength.

In Proverbs, we see that patience and self-control are better than conquering cities—this means victory in life isn't always about dominating, but about mastering ourselves. Romans encourages us to live at peace, doing all we can where possible to pursue harmony. And Philippians reminds us to put others before ourselves, humbly valuing them above our desire to be right.

When you choose to relinquish control and let go of the need to win every argument, you reflect God's character and invite His peace into your relationships. Today, pray for the strength to surrender control and the grace to walk in humility no matter the outcome.

#### Devotional: Trusting God's Perfect Justice Above All

**Surrendering your right to be right** includes surrendering your desire for personal justice. Romans reminds us not to seek revenge but to trust God's perfect justice. This can be incredibly freeing because it releases us from the burden of defending ourselves or proving our point at all costs.

Psalm 37 calls us to commit our ways to the Lord and trust that He will act on our behalf. Jesus takes this a step further by teaching us to 'turn the other cheek,' showing radical grace and trust in God's justice beyond human understanding.

By surrendering to God's justice, you demonstrate wisdom that honors God more than insisting on your own rights. Remember, God sees and judges rightly, and your trust in Him brings peace. Reflect today on areas where you need to release your claim to justice and leave it in God's hands.

#### Devotional: Harnessing the Power of Gentle Speech

**Being right** often tempts us to respond harshly or defensively when challenged. Proverbs, however, teaches us that a gentle answer not only calms conflict but reflects the deep wisdom and love of God working through us.

Ephesians encourages us to focus on words that build and uplift rather than tear down. Colossians adds that our speech should be full of grace and wisdom, ready to answer others with kindness and truth.

Letting go of your right to be right means choosing words that heal, not wound. It means surrendering the desire to 'win' a conversation and instead seeking understanding and peace. Ask God today to help you harness the power of your words and use them wisely in every interaction.

Day 5: ① Humility as True Strength

#### Devotional: Walking Humbly Reflects God's Strength

**Surrendering the right to be right** is a profound act of humility, one that God Himself honors. Micah 6:8 lays out a beautiful blueprint for godly living: justice, mercy, and humility.

Emulating Christ's mindset means putting others first, letting go of pride, and walking humbly with God. James clearly states that God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble, demonstrating that true strength comes from surrender, not self-assertion.

Reflect on how humility is more than just a quiet spirit—it is the engine of wisdom and powerful witness to those around you. When you relinquish your right to be right, you embody the holiness God desires and open the door for real transformation.

- Hebrews 12:14 "Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord."







Day 6: 🥬 Peace Over Personal Vindication

#### Devotional: Choosing to Be a Peacemaker

**Choosing peace** instead of personal vindication is a hallmark of godly wisdom and maturity. Jesus declares peacemakers blessed, revealing that heavenly reward comes from our willingness to prioritize harmony.

Romans calls us to pursue peace and build one another up, while Hebrews highlights that holiness and peace are inseparable. Holding tightly to being right often creates barriers rather than bridges.

Today, consider how your actions and words either promote peace or escalate tension. Let go of the need to prove your point and instead seek to build up and reconcile. This is true wisdom—a surrender that blesses others and honors God deeply.

#### Devotional: Resting in God's Higher Wisdom and Plan

**Letting go of being right** requires deep trust in God's sovereignty. Isaiah reminds us that God's ways and thoughts far surpass our own, inviting us to surrender our limited understanding.

Though we might plan and desire certain outcomes, Proverbs assures us the Lord's purposes prevail. Instead of clinging tightly to our own perspectives or judgments, we are called to be still, knowing God is in control and worthy of our trust.

Today, rest in the peace that comes from trusting God fully. Your surrender honors Him and demonstrates a wisdom that transcends human reasoning. As you walk in this truth, may you experience freedom and joy that comes from resting in God's perfect plan.
