As you embark on this journey, may the Holy Spirit guide your heart, sharpen your understanding, and fill you with peace that surpasses human







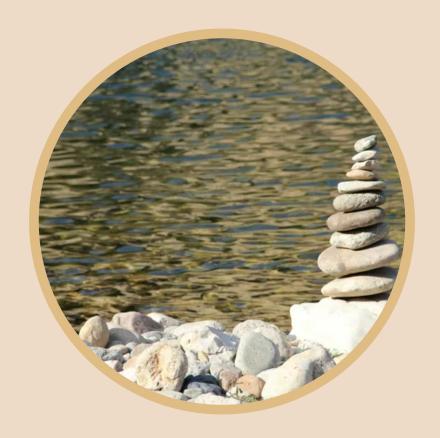
comprehension. Let this time of study become a refuge and a source of strength, equipping you to respond to hardship with wisdom anchored firmly in faith.

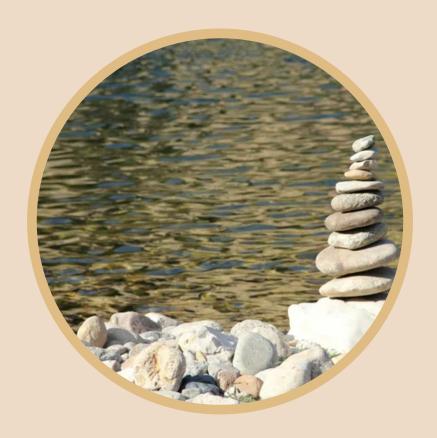


















Day 3: Visdom Guards the Heart
