Your Verse

Exodus 3:4 - 'When the LORD saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am."'

- Proverbs 2:6 "For the LORD gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding."
- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."







Devotional: Answering God's Call with Humble Readiness

Day 1 marks the beginning of Moses' transformation—from a shepherd in Midian to a leader commissioned by God. At the burning bush, Moses hears a voice that calls him by name, signaling God's intentional and personal call on his life. This encounter reveals a fundamental principle: leadership begins not with human ambition but with God's divine invitation.

God's wisdom is not abstract or distant; it interrupts Moses' routine and demands a response. Moses' readiness to answer "Here I am" reflects humility and willingness, foundational attitudes for wise leadership. This story challenges us to consider how God might be calling us today. Are we attentive to His voice amid the noise? Do we respond with obedience even when the path is unclear?

God gives wisdom generously, but it requires us to listen and say, 'Here I am.' Like Moses, stepping into leadership means acknowledging our limitations and embracing God's guidance as our source of strength.

Exodus 4:10 - "Moses said to the LORD, 'Pardon your servant, Lord. I have never been eloquent...I am slow of speech and tongue.""

- Psalm 32:8 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you."







Devotional: Facing Fear by Trusting God's Strength

Despite the powerful encounter at the burning bush, Moses' next response is one of self-doubt and insecurity. He feels inadequate, questioning his abilities to speak and lead the people. This moment teaches us that doubts are natural —even for great leaders—and that God's wisdom often unfolds through our weaknesses.

God doesn't ignore our fears but meets us in them. He reassures Moses, providing signs and promises that empower him to trust beyond his limitations. Similarly, God equips us with wisdom that transcends our fears and insecurities.

Leaders shaped by God's wisdom learn to rely on His strength, not their own. When doubts arise, turning to God with honesty and faith is the pathway to courageous leadership. This day challenges us to bring our insecurities before God and lean on His guidance to overcome them.

Day 3: Leading with Justice and Compassion

Your Verse

Exodus 18:21 – "But select capable men from all the people—men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain—and appoint them as officials over thousands..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Micah 6:8 "...to act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."
- Proverbs 3:3 "Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck..."







Day 3: Leading with Justice and Compassion

Devotional: Wisdom in Justice and Shared Leadership

As Moses' leadership responsibilities grew, his father-in-law Jethro gave wise counsel: to delegate leadership and appoint trustworthy men to help judge the people. This advice reflects a key element of God's wisdom in leadership —balancing justice with compassion and empowering others.

Moses' ability to listen and implement this counsel shows humility and wisdom, avoiding burnout and ensuring fair governance. Leaders shaped by God's wisdom do not hoard responsibility but build teams that share God's values of justice, mercy, and faithfulness.

Leading justly requires a heart for people and the wisdom to balance firmness with compassion. This day encourages us to evaluate our leadership: Are we seeking God's wisdom to lead with integrity and to empower others effectively?

Day 4: 6 Strengthened by God's Presence

Devotional: God's Presence: Our Source of Strength and Rest

Leadership can be draining, and Moses experienced the weight of leading a stubborn and often complaining people. In a defining moment, Moses sought reassurance from God, who promised His own presence—a promise that transformed Moses' leadership by providing rest and strength.

God's presence empowers us more than our abilities ever can. When we feel weary or overwhelmed, we can take comfort that God goes before us, providing wisdom and renewal. This is not a promise only for Moses but for every believer called to lead or face challenges.

God's wisdom shines brightest when we depend on His presence rather than our strength. Today invites you to cultivate a daily awareness of God walking with you and offering rest amidst responsibilities.

- Psalm 19:7 "The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul."
- Proverbs 6:23 "For this command is a lamp, this teaching is a light..."







Devotional: God's Law: The Foundation of Godly Wisdom

God's wisdom was not only about individual decisions but was codified in His Law given to Moses on Mount Sinai. These commandments guided the people's relationship with God and with one another, shaping a community rooted in holiness, justice, and love.

The Law represents divine wisdom expressed in practical instructions. Moses became a mediator, communicating God's standards to the people and calling them to live rightly. This highlights that wisdom involves obedience—living according to God's revealed will.

True wisdom is inseparable from knowing and obeying God's Word. It provides a foundation for ethical leadership and personal integrity. As followers of Christ, we continue to seek wisdom by immersing ourselves in Scripture and allowing it to light our path.

Your Verse

Exodus 32:11 - "But Moses sought the favor of the LORD his God. 'Lord,' he said, 'why should your anger burn against your people...?'"

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Timothy 2:1 "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people."
- Hebrews 7:25 "Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them."







Day 6: 🍑 Interceding with a Wise Heart

Devotional: Intercession: Leadership in Prayer and Compassion

One of the most profound displays of Moses' wisdom was his role as an intercessor for the Israelites when they sinned by worshipping the golden calf. Despite their rebellion, Moses prayed earnestly on their behalf, appealing to God's mercy and justice.

This moment shows that wise leaders care deeply for those they lead—they intercede, advocate, and embody God's grace. Moses' heart reflected God's desire to restore rather than condemn, demonstrating that wisdom includes a posture of humility and compassion before God.

Intercession is a powerful act of leadership shaped by wisdom and love. As we learn from Moses, praying for others aligns us with God's purposes and brings heavenly insight into our challenges.

Devotional: Courage to Lead into the Future with Faith
