Devotional: Beginnings: Seeking Wisdom Like the Queen

Devotional: Recognizing God's Blessing with Humble Hearts

The Queen's response reveals deep humility and recognition of God's hand in Solomon's success. She did not attribute the wisdom and prosperity solely to Solomon, but to the Lord who blessed him. This attitude of humility is essential when we receive God's gifts.

Humility keeps us grounded and reliant on God rather than on our own achievements. It opens our hearts to receive more from Him and to use blessings responsibly for His glory.

1 Kings 10:14-23 - Solomon's wealth and wisdom demonstrated God's provision.

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 8:18 Remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth.
- Psalm 37:4 Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.







Devotional: God's Provision Through Wisdom and Blessing

Solomon's riches and wisdom were the visible fruits of his relationship with God. His story reminds us that while material blessings can be part of God's provision, they are secondary to the wisdom and purpose God gives. The Queen's emphasis on Solomon's prosperity underscores that God's favor extends to both knowledge and provision.

Devotional: Faith Strengthened in Life's Challenges
