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Introduction

Wisdom is one of the most treasured gifts we can seek in life. The Book of *Proverbs* offers profound insights, practical lessons, and divine instruction on how to live wisely. This 3-day study will take you on a focused journey through key passages in Proverbs, revealing God's design for living with understanding and prudence.

This study is designed to help you grow in discernment so you recognize wise choices, understand the consequences of ignoring wisdom, and embrace the lasting joy that comes from God-centered understanding. Prepare your heart to encounter inspiring truths that will challenge your thinking, shape your character, and deepen your walk with God.

















Your Verse

Proverbs 1:7 - "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 111:10 "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding."
- Proverbs 9:10 "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding."







Devotional: Foundations: Fear of the LORD Starts Wisdom

Proverbs 1:7 lays the cornerstone for understanding wisdom: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge." This phrase isn't about being afraid in a fearful sense but holding deep reverence, awe, and respect for God's holiness and authority. Wisdom starts when we recognize who God is and our place before Him.

Many people chase knowledge for selfish gain or pride, but true knowledge begins with a humble heart submitted to God's rule. Proverbs contrasts this reverent fear with folly—fools reject wisdom and instruction because they think they know better or don't want accountability.

As you reflect today, ask yourself: Is God truly the authority in my life? Am I willing to learn, listen, and be taught? Wisdom from Proverbs is not merely intellectual; it is relational and transforms our actions. This reverence opens our minds and hearts to God's guidance and sets us on the path to wise living.

The fear of the Lord is a lifelong pursuit that leads to life, peace, and security. Inviting the Holy Spirit to reveal the majesty of God will enrich your journey toward wisdom.

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."
- Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."







Day 2: Wisdom's Practical Guidance

Devotional: Trust and Submit for Straight Paths

Proverbs 3:5–6 contains some of the most comforting and practical instructions about wisdom. It encourages wholehearted trust in the LORD rather than reliance on our limited understanding. Life is often complicated and confusing, but God's promise is to guide us when we submit to Him fully.

Wisdom from Proverbs is not abstract theory; it is deeply practical. It means daily choosing to trust God's plans over our own impulses and submitting every decision and path to His leading. This action requires humility and faith, knowing that God's ways are higher than ours.

As you meditate on these verses, consider areas in your life where you may be leaning too much on your understanding. Are there decisions, relationships, or worries where you need to surrender control? Ask God for wisdom per James 1:5, and trust His Word to illuminate your path like a lamp (Psalm 119:105).

Embracing this wisdom will bring peace and clarity even in uncertainty, and as you walk in submission, He will straighten your steps—aligning your life with His perfect will.

- Proverbs 16:16 "How much better to get wisdom than gold, to get insight rather than silver!"







Devotional: Pursuing Wisdom is Worth Every Cost

Proverbs 4:7 issues a powerful challenge: the pursuit of wisdom is invaluable and worth any cost. True wisdom and understanding are more precious than material wealth and are foundational to a fruitful and honorable life.

The book of Proverbs repeatedly highlights that wisdom brings blessings such as riches, honor, and prosperity—not necessarily just financial, but a richness of life marked by peace and purpose. When we prioritize seeking God's wisdom above all else, our lives align with His good purposes.

Consider the effort and sacrifice you are willing to make for wisdom. Are you willing to invest time in prayer, study, and obedience? Wisdom is not automatic but requires a deliberate heart posture to pursue understanding continually.

As you conclude this focused study, remember that the journey of wisdom is lifelong but richly rewarding. Trust God, submit to His instruction, and joyfully seek the understanding that leads to abundant life.
