Devotional: Draw Strength from Faithful Women in Scripture

Looking to the example of strong, prayerful women in the Bible encourages and empowers us. Hannah's heartfelt prayer in 1 Samuel 1:10–11 shows a woman deeply vulnerable yet bold before God, crying out for her son when her heart was broken by barrenness. Mary's song of praise in Luke's Gospel reveals a woman who understood God's faithfulness and made it her song and prayer. Like Mary, you can glorify God by declaring His greatness and trusting His plans for your family's future.

Deborah's example in Judges reminds us that women can be strong leaders and prayer warriors simultaneously. Her faithful reliance on God led Israel through difficult times—it's a powerful reminder that your prayer and leadership can impact your family and community deeply.
