#### Your Verse

Acts 18:26 NIV – "He began to speak boldly in the synagogue. Apollos wanted to go to Achaia, and the brothers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples there to welcome him."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 2 Timothy 1:7 NIV "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- Joshua 1:9 NIV "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."







#### Devotional: Embrace Boldness Rooted in God's Spirit

Boldness is essential when ministering to others, especially other women whom God calls us to encourage and uplift. In Acts 18:26, Apollos spoke boldly, empowered by the Spirit and the instruction he received. Boldness does not come from our own courage alone but from God's empowering Spirit. # Devotional: Pour Out Ministry from an Overflowing Heart

True ministry flows from a heart that overflows with Christ's living water. John 7:38 reminds us that those who believe in Jesus carry within them rivers of life-giving water. This overflow sustains our service to others and refreshes them as well.


Serving women authentically requires first being filled to overflowing by God's Spirit and love. When we draw close to Jesus and abide in Him, our ministry is not a draining task but a joyous outpouring. Psalm 23:5 assures us our cup can overflow, symbolizing God's abundant provision for every need.

Remember to receive as much as you pour out. Ministry without replenishment leads to burnout. Trust God to bless you abundantly (2 Corinthians 9:8) so you can abound in good works. Your willingness to serve isn't about striving harder but about letting Christ's life flow through you.

Ask God to fill you afresh each day, so you may serve with a heart full of love and grace. When you minister from this overflow, you create space for God's power to transform lives and renew yours as well.

#### Your Verse

Philippians 2:3 NIV - "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."

- Ephesians 4:2 NIV "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love."
- 1 Peter 5:5 NIV "Clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, 'God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble.""







Day 3: • Ministering with Humility and Grace

#### Devotional: Lead with Humility and Grace in Ministry

Humility and grace are foundational to any ministry, especially among women called to build each other up. Philippians 2:3 challenges us not to act out of selfish ambition but to value others above ourselves. Serving humbly means putting others' needs before our own desires or recognition.

Ministry with humility creates space for genuine relationships and helps maintain unity. Paul's exhortations in Ephesians 4 remind us to be gentle, patient, and bear with one another in love. These qualities prevent ministry from becoming competitive or prideful.

Humility is not weakness; it is the strength to serve without expecting accolades. 1 Peter 5 reminds us God honors humility and opposes pride. As you minister to women, remember that grace covers weaknesses and opens doors for reconciliation and encouragement.

Ask God to clothe you with humility and enable you to extend grace freely in your interactions. Bold service without humility risks harm, but humble ministry mirrors Christ's heart and invites His blessing.

#### Your Verse

Colossians 3:12 NIV – "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Galatians 5:22–23 NIV "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."
- Matthew 5:16 NIV "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."







#### Devotional: Let Christ's Character Shine Through You

Our ministry to other women is a reflection of Christ's beautiful character.

Colossians 3:12 invites us to clothe ourselves daily with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. These virtues enable us to serve in ways that draw others closer to God.

The fruit of the Spirit listed in Galatians 5 flows naturally when we stay connected to Jesus. These qualities beautify our relationships and ministries, making our service both effective and attractive. Ministry is not just what we do but how we do it—reflecting Christ's love and character.

Matthew 5:16 challenges us to let our light shine before others through good deeds. When you serve women with these Christlike attributes, you bring glory to the Father and bless those you minister to in profound ways.

Today, consider which Christlike qualities God is developing in you and how you can intentionally display them in ministry. Serving boldly and humbly begins with the inward transformation He is working in your heart.

#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 NIV – "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 46:1 NIV "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Isaiah 40:29 NIV "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







#### Devotional: God's Power Shines Bright in Weakness

Ministry is not about having all the answers or unlimited strength. Paul's words to the Corinthians remind us that God's grace is sufficient, and His power is made perfect in our weakness. Recognizing our limitations creates space for Christ's strength to rest on us.

When called to minister to other women, it's easy to feel inadequate or overwhelmed. But God meets us in those moments, providing refuge and strength (Psalm 46:1). Instead of hiding weaknesses, we're invited to boast in them as places where God's power shines.

Isaiah 40:29 assures us God gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. This means your ministry does not depend on your own might but on continual reliance on God's grace.

Let this truth liberate you from striving and performance, and rest fully in God's empowering presence as you serve boldly and humbly. Your weaknesses are gateways for His glory.

- Hebrews 4:15 NIV "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses."







#### Devotional: Lead with Compassion and Empathy Today

Compassion and empathy are critical in ministering effectively to other women. 1 Peter 3:8 calls us to be like-minded and sympathetic, loving one another with hearts full of compassion and humility. These qualities enable deeper connections and authentic ministry.

Serving with empathy means entering into the joys and struggles of others without judgment. Romans 12:15 reminds us to rejoice and mourn alongside those we serve, creating space for shared vulnerability and trust.

Jesus, our high priest, understands our weaknesses deeply (Hebrews 4:15). Reflecting His empathy enriches our ministry and builds bridges where healing and growth flourish.

Practice tuning your heart to the feelings and needs of the women you minister to. By serving compassionately, you embody Christ's love and create a safe place for transformation.

# Devotional: Follow Christ's Example of Humble Service

The ultimate example of ministry is Jesus Himself, who served with both boldness and humility. Matthew 20:26–28 reminds us that greatness in God's kingdom is marked by humble service, putting others first as Christ did.

Ministering to other women calls us to a servant's heart modeled after Jesus. He was bold in love, unafraid to reach out and serve, yet always humble, willingly giving His life for others. Our service must mirror that combination —courageous yet gentle, confident yet selfless.
