Begin each morning centered in Scripture and prayer, cultivating a spirit-led routine that empowers women to live with purpose and grace.





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### Introduction

### Your Verse

Psalm 5:3 - "In the morning, Lord, you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait expectantly."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Lamentations 3:23 "They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."
- Mark 1:35 "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed."







## Devotional: Begin Your Day Expecting God's Presence

The foundation of a Spirit-led morning routine is beginning with God's presence. Psalm 5:3 reminds us to lay our requests before the Lord every morning and wait expectantly. This posture opens our hearts to hear from God and receive His direction. Notice how Jesus rose early to pray alone (Mark 1:35), setting an example of starting the day intentionally connected to the Father.

As women, our mornings can be full of multitasking and rushing. Yet God invites us to pause and prioritize relationship with Him. When we seek Him first, our day gains focus, peace, and meaning.

Try waking a little earlier this week to spend quiet moments with God — pray, read Scripture, and listen. Let the steady faithfulness of God (Lamentations 3:23) fill you with hope and strength as you begin.

	Describe how you feel when you intentionally wait expectantly on the Lord.







## Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, thank You for Your faithful presence that never fails. Help me to rise each morning with a heart eager to seek You first. Teach me to wait expectantly on Your guidance and to trust Your plans for my day. May Your Spirit lead me in all I do, and may I find joy and peace in Your presence. Strengthen me to prioritize time with You over distractions, and help me reflect Your love as I go through my day. In Jesus' name, *Amen.*

Psalm 119:105 - "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Joshua 1:8 "Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it."
- Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is alive and active..."







## Devotional: Let Scripture Illuminate Your Morning

God's Word serves as our guiding light, especially in the quiet of the morning. Psalm 119:105 beautifully pictures Scripture as a lamp to direct our feet on the right path. When we start our day immersed in God's teachings, we equip ourselves with wisdom to navigate life's complexities.

Joshua 1:8 encourages us to meditate on God's Word constantly. This daily engagement renews our minds and aligns our thoughts with His truth. The Word doesn't just inform; it transforms — it's alive and active (Hebrews 4:12), shaping our desires and decisions.

Make reading a short passage or a verse your morning habit. Reflect on its meaning and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal how to apply it today. This practice builds spiritual sensitivity, giving you confidence to face whatever lies ahead.

Philippians 4:6 - "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 Thessalonians 5:17 "Pray continually."
- Luke 18:1 "Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up."







### Devotional: Cultivate Consistent and Thankful Prayer

**Prayer is the heartbeat of a Spirit-led morning routine.** Philippians 4:6 urges us not to be anxious but to bring every concern to God with thanksgiving. Prayer releases our burdens and invites God's peace into our hearts.

The command to "pray continually" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) reminds us that communication with God isn't limited to a fixed time; it's a lifestyle. Starting the day talking with God sets a tone of dependence and gratitude.

Jesus encouraged persistence in prayer (Luke 18:1), teaching us that unwavering trust and faith fuel our walk with God. Let your morning prayer time be honest and open — praise, confess, ask, and listen. This deepens your connection and allows the Holy Spirit to guide your day.

Proverbs 31:25 – "She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Titus 2:4-5 "Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children... and so train the young women to live self-controlled lives."
- Ephesians 3:16 "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being."







## Devotional: Wear Strength and Dignity Reliant on God

God calls women to embody strength and dignity in the everyday. Proverbs 31:25 portrays a woman confident and poised, unshaken by future uncertainty because of her foundation in God.

Titus 2:4–5 highlights the importance of godly character not only for our own lives but also as a testimony and guide for others. Our Spirit-led mornings shape this character as we fix our eyes on Jesus.

Ephesians 3:16 speaks to the inner strength we receive through the Holy Spirit, empowering us from within. Let your morning routine be a time to put on this clothing of strength, not through willpower, but by relying on God's Spirit and promises.

### Devotional: Tune In to the Holy Spirit's Guidance

In your morning quiet time, take moments to pause and be still, allowing the Spirit to whisper insights, encouragement, or correction. # Devotional: Walk Forward with God's Strength and Peace
