Devotional: Encouraging Words Shape Hearts and Homes

The words you speak to your children and their spouses can either heal or hurt. As grandmothers, you play a pivotal role in offering encouragement and wisdom wrapped in grace. Proverbs tells us that the wise woman's speech brings faithful instruction — not harsh criticism or nagging. When you support your children as parents, your voice should be a source of encouragement that uplifts and strengthens rather than undermines their confidence.

Choose words that build up rather than tear down, remembering that your children face daily pressures and decisions you may not fully see. You can minister by listening carefully, validating struggles, and gently offering godly counsel when appropriate.

Remember Jesus's example: He spoke truth with kindness and compassion. By doing the same, you foster peace and openness within your family, creating space for collaboration and unity as you walk this ministry together.

Devotional: Boundaries Built on Love and Respect
