Devotional: Embrace Your God-Given Identity and Worth

Devotional: Choose Quiet Strength and Wise Leadership

Deborah's story is an extraordinary example of leadership in a male-dominated society. She was a judge, prophet, and respected leader who combined strength with gentleness. Deborah did not shout over others to command respect; instead, she led with wisdom, courage, and *quiet confidence*.

This teaches us that exemplary leadership does not require loudness or dominance but steady faith, thoughtful decisions, and a heart aligned with God's will. In your workplace, embodying this kind of leadership might mean listening deeply, speaking with intentionality, or standing firm in difficult conversations without forcefulness.
