Devotional: Clothed with Strength and Dignity

Begin your week by embracing the strength God has already given you.

Proverbs 31:25 paints a picture of a woman who exudes strength and dignity—qualities essential for standing up for biblical truths in any setting. This strength is not worldly toughness but a God-given power that allows you to face the future without fear.

Devotional: Balancing Boldness and Grace

Standing up for biblical truth requires both courage and love. Ephesians 4:15 encourages us to speak truth in love, highlighting that how we communicate is just as important as what we say. Our words carry the power to build up or tear down.

In the workplace, you may face opposition or indifference. Colossians 4:6 reminds you to season your speech with grace—meaning your words should be thoughtful, kind, and wise. This grace opens hearts and minds rather than closing doors.

- James 1:6 "But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt."







Day 3: O Standing Firm in Faith

Devotional: Courage to Stand Without Wavering

Your Verse

Galatians 5:22–23 – "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:12 "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."
- Matthew 5:16 "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."







Day 4: B Reflecting Christ's Character

Devotional: Living Out Spirit-Filled Boldness

Boldness without the fruit of the Spirit can be mistaken for arrogance. As you stand for truth, remember that the Spirit's fruits—love, kindness, gentleness—are integral to your witness.

Galatians 5:22–23 lists qualities that make your boldness beautiful and compelling. Your workplace behavior should reflect compassion and patience even when confronting difficult conversations.

Colossians 3:12 calls you to clothe yourself with humility, humility that softens firmness and makes you approachable. Matthew 5:16 encourages you to let your good deeds shine, showing co-workers that your faith transforms your character and actions.

Day 5: Ourageous Advocacy

Devotional: Answering God's Call Boldly
