#### Devotional: Finding Our True Strength in the Lord

*Psalm 139:14* affirms that you are fearfully and wonderfully made by God. This truths counters feelings of rejection or inadequacy that the world may whisper. Instead of conforming to cultural pressures, embrace your unique design and role in God's kingdom.

Furthermore, 1 Peter 3:3-4 shifts focus from outward beauty to the precious inner self, cultivated by a gentle and quiet spirit. This inner beauty will never be cancelled or compromised because it reflects Christ's character.

Let this day be a celebration of your God-given identity and a commitment to live boldly from that place of truth.
