Devotional: Finding Unshakable Peace in Jesus

Devotional: Wisdom to Protect Your Heart

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Weakness

Strength often comes through vulnerability. In situations with narcissistic chaos, you may feel weak or powerless. Yet, God's Word encourages you to lean into His grace because His power works best when you feel weakest.

Prayer for Today

Ephesians 4:31–32 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







Devotional: Freedom in Forgiving Others

Forgiveness is a powerful choice
