Zipporah: The Forgotten Wife of Moses

Why does Zipporah's role matter to us today? In God's unfolding plan, obedience to His covenant was essential, and Zipporah's obedience highlights how critical the faith and actions of those around God's leaders can be. Her story encourages us to notice the unsung heroes who support God's purposes and challenges us to courageously obey God's will even when it is uncomfortable or unclear.







Over this 21-day study, we will dig into the scriptural narrative, cultural backdrop, and spiritual lessons of Zipporah's life. We will see how her role, although brief, intersects with Moses' mission, offers insights about covenant relationships, and reminds us that God can use anyone for His divine purposes. Why is Zipporah important? Although she appears briefly, her role as Moses' wife places her at the crossroads of the Exodus story. She introduces Moses to a family connected with God's priesthood, which provides a foundation for Moses' future mission. This shows us how God's plan often involves people in quiet but pivotal ways.

Zipporah's story invites us to consider the importance of faithfulness and protection, not only in grand gestures but also in everyday moments. Sometimes, God's work is carried out by those we least expect—through simple acts of kindness, hospitality, or courage.

One of the most dramatic and mysterious scenes in the life of Moses involves Zipporah's quick and decisive action to save him. In Exodus 4:24–26, as Moses travels to Egypt, the LORD confronts him for not circumcising his son —a critical sign of the covenant God made with Abraham and his descendants. Zipporah acts swiftly and circumcises their son herself, touching Moses' feet with the foreskin and calling him a "bridegroom of blood," a cryptic but deeply meaningful declaration.

This passage highlights the importance of covenant obedience. Zipporah's intervention underscores that the covenant relationship with God requires serious commitment and obedience—not just from leaders like Moses but within families. Her courage to act, even in an uncertain and frightening moment, preserved God's plan and Moses' mission.

For us, this event invites reflection on the seriousness of our own commitment to God's commands and the faithfulness required in covenant relationships. It also reminds us that sometimes those who stand beside God's leaders play critical roles in their success and survival.


